CHECK LIST WHEN BUYING A REGISTERED CLYDESDALE

When purchasing a registered Clydesdale horse, it is important to ensure that you have checked the following:

- The seller has in their possession the original Certificate of Registration
- The horse's colour and white markings should match the description on the Certificate of Registration
- The horse should be branded as per the brand information on the Certificate of Registration. If the horse is not branded it is hard to have it branded if not buying the horse off the breeder.
- The Certificate of Registration should be in the name of the person who is selling the horse
- If the mare is in foal a Service Certificate should be provided by the owner of the stallion who serviced, the mare
- If the horse is a stallion and is being used for breeding purposes and is over 2 years old, it should have a Stallion Veterinary Certificate of Inspection and a DNA test completed. The Certificate of Registration should have these results recorded on it
- If the horse is a gelding, make sure the Certificate of Registration has been updated to reflect this, if not ask the seller to record the date of castration and sign where indicated on the reverse side of the Certificate of Registration
- The transfer section on the reverse side of the Certificate of Registration must be completed correctly with the date of the transfer and signed by the registered owner. If registered in a partnership/company name, ensure that all the registered owners have signed the certificate as the seller.
- The Certificate of Registration and the appropriate fee (contact the Federal Office for fee) must be forwarded to the CCHS Federal Office as soon as possible for processing
- If this is the first time you have purchased a registered Clydesdale, you will be offered a Complimentary Membership to the Society until the end of the financial year (30th June) but an updated Certificate of Registration will not be issued until the Federal Office receives a completed CCHS Membership Application which is either available on the CCHS website or from the Federal Office
- Then providing everything is in order the CCHS Federal Secretary will issue you with a new Certificate of Registration with your name as the new owner recorded on it
- If there is any doubt as to the identification or description of the horse feel free to contact the CCHS Federal Office before you purchase to check the Society's records
